47 SAVED ON ROLL CALL SUNDAY

South Carolina Free Will Baptist Churches reported 47 precious souls were saved on Roll Call Sunday (Glory!). 39 people also rededicated their lives to the Lord while numerous joined the church and were baptized. Our total attendance this year was 13,475 (Up over 500 from last year) as reported by 124 (of our 128) churches making our average attendance over 108.67 (Isn't that Great!).

4 churches reported over 500 in attendance with the top attendance honor going to Pastor Bill Jacobs and the Mullins-Marion FWB Church [Full attendance figures on page 2].

Many things stand out to me during our State Meeting this year but there is one sight I believe I will never forget- All over the congregation of our State meeting men were standing as testimony to the fact that at least 5 people had been saved in their church in the first two months of the year 2000. The first annual Alumni Banquet will also be held at this time with special music from past music groups and a message by Dr Danny Dwyer.

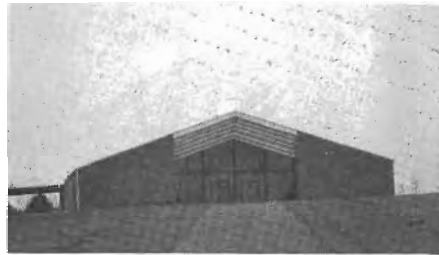

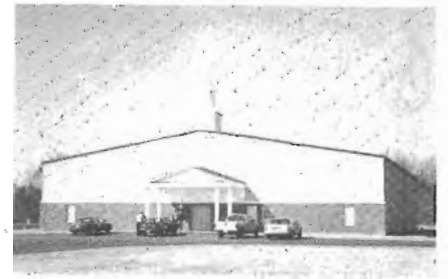


Jonathan McKnight has been selected to participate in the 2000 *Truth and Peace Student Leadership* conference. This

RESOLUTIONS adopted by the State Association of Free Will Baptist
during the February, 2000 meeting at White Savannah FWB Church.

1. Whereas promiscuity and violence continue to be propagated by a liberal society through numerous channels of entertainment, literature, and “post modernistic” education, be it resolved that we affirm our stand for moral purity, the sanctity of human life, and the worth of the human soul as supported by scripture (Gen 1:26; Levi 11:44-45); Rom 12:1-2; I Corinth 1:2; Eph 4:30; 5:25-27; Colossians 1:21-22; I Thess 4:3-8; II Tim 1:9). Be it further resolved that we refrain from all entities that would promote such unbridled behavior and jeopardize a holy standard of Christian living.

2. Whereas homosexuality is an abomination contrary to the principles of morality as stated in Leviticus 20:13 and Romans 1:26-27, and whereas “same-sex marriage” is an abomination contrary to God’s clearly defined order of the family (Genesis 1:27-28; 2:23-25), and whereas there is a consensus among groups in our nation to promote acceptance, tolerance, and legalization of the same, be it resolved that we stand in opposition to this consensus, be it the government, the military, the schools, the work force, or private residence of our American society.

3. Whereas gambling contradicts the Biblical teaching regarding the stewardship of possessions (Psalm 21:1; Proverbs 13:11; Matthew 6:21; I Corinthians 10:26), and whereas the Bible reveals that all property and possessions are provided by God and that we are accountable for their proper use; Therefore be it resolved that we reaffirm our stand against any and all forms of gambling, be it video poker, a state lottery, gambling boats, and other games of chance which cause one to put at risk their possessions provided by God. Be it further resolved that we commend the efforts of Free Will Baptist groups in our state who have cooperated with other groups to defeat the legality of video poker and encourage future cooperation toward the defeat of a potential state lottery or any other form of gambling.

4. Whereas abortion on demand, partial birth abortion, or any formality of “pro-choice” is in distinct contradiction to Biblical teaching (Exodus 20:13; Genesis 9:6; Leviticus 24:17, 21b), and whereas we are in an election year to decide the office of presidency of our United States, be it resolved that our support for candidates of said office and any other of our government be reserved for those who hold nothing less than a solid “pro-life” agenda.

5. Whereas the members of the White Savannah Free Will Baptist Church have so graciously opened their facilities and have been so gracious a host in assisting the needs of this State Association meeting, be it resolved that we, the State Association, give a rising vote of thanks for their labors of love.

(Another resolution was approved from the floor to give thanks to brother Bob Shields and his group for their work in helping the FWB Bible College in drawing plans for the relocation of the college.)

HISTORICAL GLIMPSES

Other than the third verse of a hymn, nothing is deliberately avoided as much in churches today as those sections of the Bible that deal with history. We maintain that history is boring and irrelevant, when it is neither. A strong argument can be made that an adequate knowledge of history and heritage is essential to the success of any endeavor. The South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptists is no exception to that rule.

During the State Association meeting in 1999, a Historical Commission was created to research, document, and preserve the history of the denominational work in this state. This is the first comprehensive, statewide attempt to learn the answers to some vital questions. When was Free Will Baptist doctrine first introduced into South Carolina? Who preached it, and why did they come? Where did they settle and begin to build churches? Who were the early men of God who labored so sacrificially that we might inherit an organizational structure and a proud heritage of service to the cause of God? This is the first of a series of articles in THE INFORMER that will address these and many other issues.

The journey back in time to our roots begins in the early years of the nineteenth century. The year was 1816. America was a young nation. It had been only forty years since the Declaration of Independence was signed. We had fought two wars with Great Britain in that time span, the latest being the War of 1812. The nation was focusing on growth and expansion. People were moving from place to place seeking economic stability and a sense of community with others of common faith and heritage. One of those who migrated was a man named Redding Moore. It is with him that our story begins. [Continued Next Issue]
