The Purpose of Roll call is 1) To see souls saved and lives changed for the glory of God. 2) To encourage outreach. 3) To build a database of prospects for your church. 4) To introduce your church and ministry to more people in your community. 5) To stimulate evangelism and church growth for the local church. 6) To make more people aware of who Free Will Baptists are and what we believe. 7) To present Christ to a lost and dying world.

Pastor Lee Patrick of First FWB Church, Florence sent in this Roll Call report: March 27-28th was a special weekend at FFWB in Florence. It all began with a children's service on Saturday and ended with a packed out service on Sunday. Everyone was treated to special singing by the Poston's and a BBQ and chicken bog lunch. When all was said and done, 255 first time visitors had been registered with 747 total people in attendance. It was worth it all because at the end of the service many were on the altar and 1 precious soul was saved.

Pastor Neil Hinson and the Mullins-Marion FWB Church reported over 600 in attendance on Roll Call Sunday again this year (619). This is the second year in a row that this country church has managed to break the 600 barrier. What a great testimony to the hard work and vision of this fine church.



Roll Call Sunday was a big day for **Converse FWB Church**. Not only did they have 121 in Church with 2 salvations but they also raised \$7,777.77 in a "Resurrection Offering" to help them purchase 7.11 acres for their eventual relocation on a frontage Rd where I-85, Business 85 and hwy 221 converge. Originally priced at \$227,520, after much prayer and negotiations, they were able to purchase the property for \$100,000!

Pastor Todd Black had asked the Church to fast and pray the entire week of Easter and then give a Resurrection offering, over and above their normal tithes, to go toward the land purchase. The need for all of this is because God has saved 44 and 41 have joined the church in the last 16 months.

Missionaries Returning to the States in July:

Andy and Andrea Moore, Bobby and Geneva Poole, and Carlisle Hanna will all return to the State for short assignments in July. Pray for them during this transition time.

Poole Report: Serving the Lord on a mission field is not a lot different than serving the Lord where you were born and reared. It is hard in any place and the devil attacks and desires to steal, kill and destroy. God has placed us in a city of about 700,000 people, Ribeirão Preto. We have wealth and poverty, good guys and bad guys and where there are thousands that do not know the Lord.

At this point there are three FWB Churches, with over 300 FWB worshipers in our services each Sunday. We have a Seminary (Bible College and Bible Institute) that has touched the lives of a few hundred leaders, including pastors, Sunday school teachers, youth leaders, deacons, soul winners and folks that just simple wanted to learn more about the Word of God. But the devil is still attacking! So please continue to hold the ropes as we try to reach souls that are falling into the pit of hell. We will be praying for you in your place of service.

On a closing note. We will be on Stateside Assignment starting the first part of July, 2004 for six months, returning to Brazil the first part of January, 2005. If you would like to have us for a service, please write us bpoole@nafwb.org and it will be a joy for us to share what God is doing through our FWB in Brazil. We hope to see many of you at the National Association in Kansas City.

Thanks for your love, prayers and support that has made our ministry in Brazil possible.

While **Missionary Carlisle Hanna** was meeting Steve Lytle and Theron Scott (Who were to speak at the annual National Meeting) in New Delhi he fell and **broke his wrist**. They wanted to take him to the doctor then but he refused and went on to Bagdogra and then to the mission station to get the guest speakers settled in for the meeting. He then went to Siligiri hospital where surgery was performed on his left wrist. Eventually it was found that he also had a slight fracture in his hip. In spite of all of this the conference went well and they baptized 72 (Glory!).

Brother Carlisle is continuing his work as he mends and expects to return to the states July. Remember him in prayer- and remember the great financial need of the work in India.

The Ladies Auxiliary of Little Star FWB Church (Lake City) placed an Easter Basket with empty plastic eggs in the foyer of the Church and asked each church member to take an egg home, put a love offering in it, and return it the next Sunday. Next Sunday \$826.60 "hatched" from these eggs to help Brother Carlisle Hanna in India.

The following is an article from CONTACT Magazine written by William Evans Director of the Free Will Baptist Board of Retirement. Hopefully, it will show some of the benefits of properly designating the Pastor's Salary. (used with permission).

WHEN DOES 2 + 2 = MORE THAN 4?

The laws of mathematics will never allow the equation above. However, all of us know that getting more for our money is possible if we shop wisely. The principals that increase our purchasing power are also available in the area of financial planning.

So, what can a Pastor do to stretch his pay package? One of the first things to consider is the way his pay package is arranged and noted in the minutes of the church or its official board. The following example will illustrate how a few simple steps can increase the effective economic power of the same pay package.

Assumptions: The pastor is married; he has two children; his wife works outside the home and has hospitalization insurance for herself, she pays extra for family coverage. The church provides a salary package of \$20,000 with a parsonage and all utilities.

extra income to the pastor at no additional cost to the church.

*These figures are given for illustration purposes only. For your personal situation it is important that all IRS requirements be met to exempt these items from income taxes and self-employment taxes.

Is your church making the most of your present package? If not, please call our office for some information on how you can give your pastor a raise at no cost to the church. The illustration above deals with the pay package as agreed to with the pastor. In cases where the church will consider nothing else arranging the package in a tax wise way will stretch its benefits. There is a better way though.

Look at the other side of the pay package issue. How much is your church paying your pastor? Is that amount reasonable for the size and financial ability of your church? If not consider making some changes in your budget. In the event your church is really doing all it can, make sure your personal attitude expresses gratefulness for his service to you and your family.

There are several things to consider. Do you expect him to provide transportation for his work? If so, see to it that visitation both community and hospital does not come out of his family income. How would you feel if your employer asked you to furnish your own transportation to do his work? The IRS considers 37.5 cents per mile a "standard deduction" amount. Should you do anything less?

Do you expect him to preach fresh, challenging sermons regularly? If so, you should see to it that he has an ever increasing source of reference material to study. A generous book allowance, provided by the church, will help. If your church is to grow and please the Lord it is essential that you do what you can to see that your pastor is provided with reasonable pay.

Most employers provide some type of life/disability insurance for their employees even if it is nothing more than half their social security payments and worker's compensation. Can a church who cares for its pastor do less?

Then there is the issue of health insurance. This is probably the most difficult of all benefits to provide and manage. The answers are not easy but how would your church feel if your parsonage family experienced a serious long term illness? Do something for them.

Benefits provided by the church are naturally the most beneficial for the pastor. Help your church do what it can to meet these financial needs. If you are doing all you can as a church at least help the pastor arrange his package in the most cost effective way possible. Then the benefits of his package will add up to more than the simple sum of its dollar value.

Roll Call Sunday was a good day for **Pastor Jimmy Brown and the First FWB Church of Myrtle Beach**. Sunrise service featured the SCFWB Executive Secretary speaking and ending with a Baptismal service for a Mother and her daughter- Glory!. A full breakfast fellowship followed. The Morning Worship Service was made extra special when 2 Children were dedicated to the Lord. It was a great day for the 228 in attendance.



This church is also in the process of remodeling their parsonage. The foundation and brick exterior had begun to give problems so they removed the brick and replaced it with vinyl as well as adding a new back porch and additional room in other areas.

Free Will Baptist National Convention to Meet in Kansas City

The National Association of Free Will Baptists meets in Kansas City, Missouri, July 18-22, 2004, for its 68th annual session. Executive Secretary Keith Burden says he expects 6,000 delegates and visitors from 40 states at Kansas City Convention Center for the five-day meeting. For the seventh time, Missouri's 15,000 members and 186 churches will host the national convention. The National Association previously met in Missouri in 1944 (Flat River); 1958, 1969 (St. Louis); 1964, 1978, 1988 (Kansas City).

The National Association of Free Will Baptists includes 2,500 churches and 215,000 members. The denomination supports 106 missionaries in 13 foreign countries and 138 home missionaries in the United States, Canada, Mexico, Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico.

National convention delegates are expected to approve denominational budgets which will exceed \$22 million. Moderator Tim York will gavel the voting body through electing 31 board and commission members and general officers. Each national agency and commission will submit an annual report to delegates during the two-day convention business session on Wednesday and Thursday.

The 2004 convention theme is "Harvest Time." Five pastors will deliver major addresses: Glenn Murray (United FWB Church/West Plains, Missouri), Kerry Gandy (Rolling Oaks FWB Church/Maumelle, Arkansas), Randy Wright (Piney Grove FWB Church/Beaverton, Alabama), José Rodriguez (Ebenezer FWB Church/Miami, Florida) and Glen Johnson (Good News FWB Church/Chesterfield, Virginia). Missouri layman Bob Farwell, a science and math instructor as well as creation science lecturer, will teach the Adult Sunday School Class.

Meeting simultaneously with the National Association are the 37th annual National Youth Conference (NYC), with an expected 1,500 registrants and the 69th annual Women Nationally Active for Christ (WNAC) Convention with more than 700 women anticipated.

The four-day NYC which includes Bible competitive activities as well as a music and arts festival will rally around the theme, "Xtreme Cause, Xtreme Cost," from Matthew 10:38. NYC will conduct separate worship services for youth. Numerous seminars are scheduled for attendees. Several hundred teens will participate in "Reach That Guy" service and work projects within the Kansas City community. The youth will meet with adults Wednesday evening for a combined worship service at Kansas City Convention Center.

The two-day WNAC theme is "Great Expectations." During a two-hour Monday afternoon seminar, delegates will get a first look at "Show Me HGTV-WNAC Style" led by Debbie Burden. Tuesday's business session convenes at Kansas City

Convention Center. The WNAC keynote service will feature foreign missionaries to Japan, Don and Ruth McDonald. Missionary Lynette Morgan (on special assignment) will address the Fellowship Luncheon at noon Tuesday.

Tuesday morning's Preaching Conference meets in Kansas City Convention Center. Participants at the two-hour conference will hear Tulsa, Oklahoma, pastor David Archer and Burton, Michigan, pastor Allen West.

The Monday afternoon (3:00-5:00 p.m.) Missions Rally in Kansas City Convention Center will feature leadership speaker, Charlie "Tremendous" Jones, who will share help in the areas of missions outreach and evangelism.
