February 18 - 19, 1988

The service opened by singing "When We All Get to Heaven". Rev. Eddie Riddick was the song leader, and Rev. Theron Scott was the pianist. These served during the entire session, unless stated otherwise. Rev. James Earl Raper led in prayer.

The moderator brought his message. (Appendix J). The clerk called the convention to order. The Host Pastor, Rev. Talmadge Brown gave the welcome. The delegates were then seated. The program was then approved. The Committee on Committees was appointed. They were as follows: Rev. Henry Potter as chairman, Rev. John Suttles, Rev. Johnnie Bullman, Rev. William Jacobs, and Rev. David Carter.

The visitors were recognized and then made welcome. MSC to accept the True Life Association into membership of the South Carolina State Association. The National Representatives were then recognized. Other representatives from other areas and offices were recognized. Rev. Joe Cagle shared with us a law that involved Christian Schools.

THURSDAY MORNING WORSHIP

We opened by singing "Blessed Assurance". Rev. Charles Brown led in the prayer. Rev. Billy Baker from the Central Association brought the morning message. He read from Acts 11:21-26. He pointed out what Christians are to be like while living in this world. Rev. Ron Moore led in prayer and we then had dinner.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

We opened by singing "Faith is a Victory". Rev. Reedy Saverance led in prayer. Rev. Buddy Seay from the Eastern Conference brought the devotion. He read from Psalms 73:24. He pointed out how God guides His people as we live. Rev. Wayland Owens then shared with us the fact of him going full time with his church, and quitting his secular employment.

The Credentials Committee Partial Report was given. (Appendix II). MSC to accept. The Committee on Committees Report was given (Appendix III). MSC to accept. The State Executive Committee Report was given. (Appendix IV). MSC to accept items 1,2,3,4,5,6.

Rev. Talmadge Brown gave a report from the Special Study Committee (Appendix V). MS to accept item by item. MSC to amend to accept it all at one time. MSC to accept as amended. MSC for the moderator to appoint an administrator and members for the Retirement Village. Rev. Talmadge Brown as chairman, and the following as Board of Trustees: Bro. A.C. Allen, Rev. Bobby Bowers, Rev. Norwood Gibson, and Rev. Roger Johnson.

We sang "Stand Up for Jesus". Rev. James Earl Raper gave a report from the Bible College. MSC to accept as information. Rev. Norwood Gibson gave a word of greeting in behalf of the Foreign and Home Missions office.

The Promotional Director gave his report (Appendix VI). MSC to accept. MSC to pay to our Promotional Director \$743.75. This was for his 1987 Christmas gift, and retirement that he had not yet received. The State Home Missions Report was given (Appendix VII). MSC to accept. The Children's Home Report was given (Appendix VIII). MSC to accept. MSC to adjourn until the night service.

THURSDAY NIGHT WORSHIP

The service opened by singing "Victory In Jesus". Rev. Danny Howell led in prayer. The Southeastern Quartet then sang. Rev. Billy Potat led in prayer. The offering was then taken. Rev. Talmadge Brown led in the time of testimonies. The Southeastern Quartet sang. Rev. Randy Sawyer from the Southeastern College brought the message. He read from Rev. 1:5-11. He talked about Jesus being the Alpha and the Omega.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

The service opened by singing "Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus". Rev. Theron Scott led the singing, and Rev. Randy Sawyer served as the pianist. Rev. Joe Haas led in prayer. Rev. Rick Cason from the South Carolina Conference brought the devotion. He read from 2 Kings 4:9. He talked about what folks expect to see in the pastors and preachers.

New visitors were then recognized and welcomed. The CTS Report was given (Appendix IX). MSC to accept. The Youth Camp Report was given (Appendix X). MSC to accept. The Minister's Retirement Report was given (Appendix XI). The Retirement Board gave the following recommendations.

1. The present program paying \$35.00 monthly to 14 recipients be terminated effective June 30, 1988.
 2. The local conference be encouraged to assume responsibility for those retirees affiliated with each particular conference.
 3. The "Matching Funds" program be reinstated, effective June 1, 1988. MSC to accept item by item.
- The Poston Baggett Loan Fund Report was given (Appendix XII). MSC to accept. Rev. Joe Haas from Southeastern College stood and gave a word of greeting. Rev. Ron Moore, Missionary of Ivory Coast gave words of greeting.

FRIDAY MORNING WORSHIP

The service opened by singing "Jesus Saves". Rev. Ansel Smith led in prayer. The Southeastern Quartet sang. Rev. Norris Hawkins from the Beaver Creek Association brought the message. He read from Galatians 1:1-5. He talked about the purpose of the Cross. We then had dinner.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The service opened by singing "He Lives". Bro. Carlisle Jones led in prayer. Rev. Larry McAlister from the Palmetto Conference brought the devotion. He read from Mark 9:2. He talked about mountain experiences that are found in the Bible. Rev. Earl Hanna shared with us about the work in Orangeburg.

Rev. Melvin Worthington, National Executive Secretary, gave his report. MSC to accept as information. The Resolutions Committee gave their report (Appendix XIII). MSC to accept. The Treasurer's Report was given (Appendix XIV). MSC to accept.

The Credentials Committee Report was given (Appendix XV). MSC to accept. Rev. Buddy Seay gave the Woman's Auxiliary Report (Appendix XVI). MSC to accept. We stood for a break. MS to raise the salary of the Promotional Director \$25.00 per week. MS to amend this to \$50.00 per week. MSC to accept this amendment. MSC to accept as amended. MSC to have this retroactive January 1, 1988.

Rev. Talmadge Brown was elected as the General Board Member to the National Association. The Nominating Committee Report was given (Appendix XVII). MSC to accept. MSC for the clerk to send a recommendation to the National Nominating Committee that Rev. Norwood Gibson remain on the National Foreign Missions Board.

The Public Morals Committee Report was given (Appendix XVIII). MSC to accept. MS for the Executive Committee to send one copy of the Digest of Reports to pastors and delegates before the State Association meets. This would give them time to look them over in advance. MS to amend this by sending it with the Informer that has the State Program in it. MSC to accept the amendment. MSC to accept as amended.

MSC to give the Host Church and Association a rising vote of thanks for the fine hospitality that was shown. MSC to adjourn. Bro. Allen Baxley in prayer.

APPENDIX IV
Executive Committee Report

We met April 13, 1987 at Fellowship FWB Church. The following is information on this meeting. Conference or Association moderators also met with us. 1-5 were done at this meeting.

1. We planned the 1988 State Program.
2. We discussed how the State Treasurer could pay for the printing of the Informer. The Conference and/or Association moderators were to share this with their churches.
3. We agreed for the State Treasurer to pay for the moderators dinner that day.
4. We agreed for the Promotional Director to check with other printers to see if the printing of the Informer could be done any cheaper.
5. Rev. Joe McKnight shared with us about the Ministers Retirement Fund.
6. We agreed to send Rev. Raymond Coffey a note informing him that he would not be speaking at the State since he was no longer with Southeastern College. His invitation was based on him being with the college.
7. We agreed to get Rev. Randy Sawyer from Southeastern College to bring the message Thursday night.
8. We agreed for the Promotional Director to talk with the Women's Auxiliary and the CTS leaders about them meeting at the same time as the State Association, if the State started to meet at a central location, in future years.
9. We agreed for the clerk to send reminders to the Board of Directors and Moderators about the meeting with them, the day before the State Association.
10. The Promotional Director shared with us his work with the Children's Home.
11. We agreed for folks outside of our State Association to set up booths at the State Meeting. They would be encouraged to give a donation to the host church.
- Items 6-11 were done at the November 16, 1987 meeting.
1. We recommend that each local conference/association represent to the State Association with an annual fee of \$75.00 per church in its membership. The increase of \$32.00 will be designated toward the printing cost of the state media, The Informer. This way the State Association will be assuming the responsibility of paying for the printing of The Informer.
2. We recommend that the current policy of allowing two National Offices to represent at the State Association be changed to the following policy. The moderator will recognize each departmental representative and will give him a few minutes to convey greetings from the floor.

3. We recommend that the State Association authorize the current State Executive Committee to study the feasibility of implementing a General Board form of government, and a board budget system to the State Association and to present a plan for this structure at the 1989 session. This addition to the State Office would give an opportunity for greater input to state affairs by the conferences/associations. The general idea is that the board would consist of a member from each conference/association, possibly the moderator.

We met the day before the State Association. From this meeting, we recommend the following.

4. We recommend that the Promotional Directors housing allowance be raised from \$75.00 weekly to \$100.00, and that it be retroactive Jan. 1, 1988.
5. We recommend that we send our Promotional Director to Washington, D. C. to represent the State Association at the meeting of the American Association of Christian Schools. This will be the week following the State Association.
6. We recommend that the 1988 Pop Willey Missions Offering be as follows:
 - 45% to National Foreign Missions
 - 5% to National Foreign Missions General Fund
 - 20% to State Home Missions
 - 20% to Local Conference/Association Missions
 - 10% to National Home Missions General Fund

APPENDIX V SPECIAL STUDY COMMITTEE

This committee wishes to report to the S. C. State Association the findings of a feasibility study concerning retirement living facilities for our ministers and laymen.

After examining the issues involved, we made the following recommendations:

1. We recommend that this body vote in favor of establishing a "retirement village", which will be located in Turbeville, South Carolina.
2. This complex will be located on land presently owned by the State Association. This land is part of the property associated with the "Children's Home".
3. The State Association, or the moderator, appoint a Board of Trustees, and an Administrator. This Board will carry out the following functions during the year of 1988:
 - a. Determine suitable construction plans for one duplex housing unit.
 - b. Research all applicable state and local building ordinances.
 - c. Determine necessary insurance coverages, and the cost of obtaining these coverages.
 - d. Accept applications and select the first resident(s).
 - e. Present the plans and needs of this ministry before local churches and conferences.
 - f. Seek out resources and assistance which could be used during actual construction to help reduce costs.
 - g. Make a full report of their activities and findings at the 1989 State Association.
 - h. The Administrator, along with the Board of Trustees, will oversee the construction and future operation of the "Retirement Village".
4. The first duplex will be financed by a \$50,000 Capital Fund Campaign. The State Moderator will meet with the Conference or Association Executive Committees to determine individual Conference goals for this Campaign. The Campaign goal is to raise \$50,000 by the 1989 State Meeting. If the goal is met, construction on the first unit should begin as soon as possible, with a target completion date of June 1, 1989.
5. Once the first unit is occupied, the income generated will be used to construct a second unit, when the need arises.
