June 14, 1993 1 p.m. - All State officers, General Board members, Directors, Chairmen of boards and Board members were urged to attend the meeting with Attorney Robert Lee to be informed as to how State incorporation would affect the various State ministries.

Earl Hendrix, Danny Howell, David Aycok, Bobby Bowers, Norwood Gibson, Earl Hanna, William Jacobs, Floyd "Buddy" Seay, Jr., Kenny Baxley, Ansel Smith, Robert Rose, James Wilhide, Sigbee Dilda, John Cody, Phil Limmons, Jeff Bolt, Austin Martin, Murrel Young, Charles Beasley, Lamar Smith, Fred Kirby, and Donnie Miles.

The State Moderator (Earl Hendrix) declared the motion passed at the 1993 State meeting regarding the use of the money from the sale of the Children's Home property (see p.8 in 1993 Minutes) to be null and void and the Children's Home has exclusive right to the money from the sale of the Children's Home property.

Joint Session (Executive Committee and General Board)

MSC to change the Pop Willey Fund emphasis month to April

MSC to contribute \$617.50 to Norwood Gibson's retirement for the 1992 year due to lack of funds in the Promotional Office.

MSC to express our appreciation to Attorney Robert Lee for his invaluable service to our State Association by presenting him a check for \$200.00

December 14, 1993 - Columbia, SC

Point of Information: Bill Jacobs resigned from the Youth Camp Board due to health problems.

MSC to recommend the findings of the Executive Committee on Incorporation for consideration to the General Board and be further recommended for approval by the State Association body.

Findings On Incorporation:

At the 1993 convention of the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptists, the body gave approval for the State Executive Committee to incorporate the South Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptists

"MSC to authorize the Executive Committee to draw up the charter to incorporate our South Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptists".

(1993 State minutes p.8 #5)

The Executive Committee met with attorney Robert Lee to proceed with the above instructions and authorization. The Executive Committee learned at this meeting that if the State Association was incorporated, State ministries would come under the umbrella of the State incorporation and that changes in the structure of our current financial procedures would have to be made. According to Robert Lee a State treasure would have to be established to receive and disburse all financial contributions. He suggested several ways that this could be done so that we could maintain the practice of each ministry disbursing its own funds. The Executive Committee later learned that the Free Will Baptist Home for Children in Turbeville was already incorporated and according to attorney Robert Lee this means that the Children's Home is an entity unto itself; and in reality it is not a ministry under the control of the State Association.

In view of the above knowledge, the Executive Committee arranged a meeting of the General Board with attorney Robert Lee to share this information. He gave a more detailed explanation of what would be involved if the State Association followed through with the incorporation. Board members were given the opportunity to ask questions.

As a result of the two meetings, and the information received, the Executive Committee agreed that it would be best not to proceed further with incorporation until this information was shared with the State body at the convention in February 1994. This decision was based primarily on the assumption that the State Association may not want to follow through with the incorporation after learning of the ramifications. It was further concluded that the State body should make the decision to incorporate and meet its requirements or discontinue the pursuit thereof and remain as we are.

MSC to authorize our Promotional Director to get a loan to complete the enclosing of the front porch of the Promotional Office.

Executive Committee and General Board

February 22, 1994 - Inman, SC

Item #1 - MSC for the Executive Committee to proceed with incorporation

Item #2 - MSC for the Executive Committee and the Treasurers of each ministry to study and implement the proper financial structure to comply with the requirements for incorporation.

Item #3 - MSC to receive the reports and the Constitutional changes in the Church Training Constitution and By-Laws.

Item #4 - MSC to create a College Loan Fund and that it operate with the following stipulations:

1. Make the Loan Fund available to any Free Will Baptist College student of South Carolina.

2. Must comply with the wishes of the donors by:

1) Encouraging other memorial funds to be set up for any Free Will Baptist College.

2) Providing the means by which donors can give to the general College Loan Fund or designate to a specific college or a specific loan fund that is set up.

3) Operating the Poston Baggett Loan Fund under the College Loan Fund as it presently exists.

APPENDIX IX
Church Training Report

The 1993 State Convention met on May 14 & 15, at Westside FWB Church, Johnsonville. Donnie Miles, Director, presided over the meeting. Rev. Theron Scott

and Rev. Sanders of First Church in Chester presented the devotionals. There were 5 Bible Memorization contestants, 5 Sword Drillers, 2 Tic-Tac-Toe teams, and 2 Bible Bowl teams. In Music & Arts there were 45 entries. Winners were announced and awards presented.

There 176 in attendance including 69 contestants from 3 districts and 15 churches. The offering, dues and registrations totaled \$1,688.23.

The following revisions to the Church Training constitution and by-laws were MSC:

Constitution:

1. Article IV - Officers add and Assistant Youth Chairman.
2. Article VII - Committees, item 1, add Corresponding Secretary, Assistant Youth Chairman, and Treasurer.
3. Article VIII - Finances, change paragraph 1 to read, Each district CTS shall be required to send to the State CTS a minimum of \$35 for each local CTS which participates in the district convention.

Article VIII - Finances, cont.

In paragraph 2, first sentence, delete "(from district and each participating CTS composing its membership)".

Paragraph 3 should read, Registration fees will also be forwarded to State Youth Chairman for participants in competitive activities. Said fees will be the same as fees imposed by the National. All registration fees will be non-refundable.

By-Laws

4. Article I - Duties of Officers, Under Corresponding Secretary add Will serve on Executive Committee.

Under Treasurer add will serve on Executive Committee.

Add Assistant Youth Chairman: The Assistant Youth Chairman shall serve in the absence of the Youth Chairman and provide assistance as requested by the Youth Chairman. Will serve on the Executive Committee.

5. Article III - Appropriations, item 2, first sentence, omit words "Youth Rally". Sentence will read "State winners shall receive..."

Add:

3. The State CTS Convention shall purchase the youth banquet ticket for each contestant representing the State at the National.

4. All of the above funds will be disbursed at the discretion of the Executive Committee based upon the availability of funds.

6. Article IV - Competition, item 2, first sentence, change "must have a score of 55 out of a possible 70" to must have a No.1 rating.

Item 2, second sentence, change "provided a score of 55 was attained" to provided a No.1 rating was attained.

7. In constitution and By-Laws, all references to rally should be changed to convention. MSC to recommend Rev. Phillip Jones to the State Association as the incoming board member to replace the outgoing board member.
